Recently, we got the letter from the General Secretary regarding the Coronavirus (Covid-19). We are encouraging paying close attention to the cleaning of high traffic spaces and surfaces (tables, chairs, railings, etc.). We considered alternatives to cancelling the peace and greet on Sunday. This situation makes sense, but on the other hand It is sad .

According to CNN news, "More than 7,300 coronavirus infections have been confirmed throughout South Korea, killing more than 50. It is one of the largest outbreaks outside mainland China, where the deadly virus was first identified. However, the number of new daily infections in South Korea has declined in recent days." When I read this article, I was terrified due to the confirmed amount, but the next article made me relax: "The South Korean government has been among the most ambitious when it comes to providing the public with free and easy testing options. It has the ability to run about 15,000 diagnostic tests per day and has conducted 196,000 tests to date nationwide, free of charge. Authorities in the city have even set up drive-thru testing booths." I understand why so many people have been confirmed. South Korean Government strictly controls this crisis and recommends that churches stop worship on Sunday and public events. The majority of churches will be closed on Sundays until the situation is stabilized. It is the first case that churches are officially postponing services in 120 years of church history. Churches are grieving because of this.

Lent offers all of us a very special opportunity to grow in our faith and relation with God. To deepen our commitment to the way of life journey. In our suffering world, this season of Lent gives us an abundant opportunity to change our patterns, to pray more deeply, experience hard times for what we've done and failed to do or what we are failing now, and to be generous to those in need. It is not just about our personal reflection and spiritual practice, but about how we can share the Christ suffering with our neighbours. Our Lenten journey may be about forgiving, sacrifice, reconciliation, sharing, or giving up.

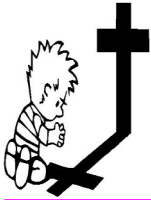
