### Psalm 149

The sting here is not in the tail but in the middle The first five verses of the tone for the whole psalm, which celebrates God's kingship and sovereignty. A "new" song is certainly appropriate for people who have experienced God's salvation and glory, but the sense of the Long adoring the humble with victory introduces a "holy war" theme. True, the victory is God's, and is in no way achieved by the people's own strength. However, a disturbing issue here is the description of the faithful carrying two-edged swords and wreaking vengeance on their enemies (v6). No wonder some individuals in the past have assumed that this psalm provides a warrant to promote violence in God's name.<sup>10</sup>Yes, it is true that the faithful are summoned to join with God in promoting justice and righteousness, and at times face opposition. But from the New Testament we learn that our two-edged sword is that of word and spirit.<sup>11</sup> This means that in any conflict situation we will find our true identity in Christ through the suffering that we may endure. What inspires us is the way Jesus exemplifies the power of God in his inauguration of the divine reign, which is not in the power of aggressive warfare, but in the power of persistent love.
